The order of the circuit court granting a stay of execution for Gregory Mills is rendered moot by the order vacating the death sentence; and therefore, appellant's Motion to Vacate Stay of Execution is denied without prejudice.

Appellant's Motion to Expedite Appellate Proceedings is hereby granted in part. Appellant's brief is to be served on or before May 13, 2001; appellee's brief shall be served 10 days after service of appellant's brief; and appellant's reply brief shall be served 5 days after service of appellee's brief.
